

# OPENING A BOOK IS NOT ENOUGH

- You may open a book from library shelves because of a teacher's assignment, but opening the book for this reason is not enough.
- You may open a book from library shelves because of a sincere interest, but just opening a book for this reason is not enough.
- You may open the book and actually read all or some of the blub, but opening a book to this extent is not enough.
- You may open it, read all or some of the blub, and also read the first page or pages, but this is not enough.
- You may open it, read the blub, and check it out, but this is not enough.
- You may open it, check it out, and read the first chapter or chapters, but this is not enough.
- You may open it, check it out, and read it from first page to last, but this is not enough.
- You may open it, check it out, read it from first page to last, and write something intelligent about it. This is not enough either, but it's closer.
- You may open a book from library shelves, check it out, read it from first page to last, and share something intelligent about it in writing not only for your teacher but for a larger audience.

## **This is enough!**

- You may open the book, check it out, read it from first page to last, and **share publicly something intelligent** about it for peers and for adults.

## **This is undeniably enough!**
