Practical Wisdom

- making decisions only after resolving conflicting information
- drawing conclusions based on the strength of evidence
- tolerating ambiguity until clarification is possible
- adjusting for one's own biases

Although intelligence tests do measure the brain's processing power reasonably well, they don't measure Practical Wisdom well.
